Meet the Volunteer Tony Walker



Can you tell us a bit about you?

Hi, I'm Tony Walker, one of the volunteers at Haringey Fixers. I have been a child coordinator for over 20 years, focusing on childcare, and various related responsibilities. After retiring, I saw Haringey Fixers as the perfect opportunity to get involved and give back to the community.

At Haringey Fixers, we collaborate with people to repair their broken items. We handle most household items that can be carried in by hand, so please note that we don't work on large appliances like washing machines 🗢

What are your particular skills?

I am an engineer with a background in mechanical engineering, having completed an apprenticeship in the field. I am skilled in computer repair and proficient in troubleshooting and repairing most household electrical items.

What is actually easier to repair than people think?

Many people don't realise that they can repair more things themselves than they might expect, once they put their minds to it. Often, the items brought in for repair simply need to be taken apart and reassembled. Sometimes, the issue is as simple as accumulated dust or a loose connection. With basic troubleshooting skills, anyone can do it—you don't need to be a professional.

We often see toasters and lamps, which are among the easiest items to repair. For toasters, it's often just a matter of taking them apart, cleaning them, and reassembling. Lamps follow a similar process. While computers might require a bit more advanced knowledge, basic troubleshooting can go a long way. Plus, there are plenty of step-by-step videos available online that can guide you through fixing household appliances.

What do you enjoy about volunteering?

What I enjoy most about volunteering is meeting people from diverse backgrounds with a wide range of skills. I learn a lot from these interactions, as many of the volunteers are highly skilled individuals who come to share their expertise while enjoying themselves.

One of the reasons I volunteer at Haringey Fixers is the opportunity to continually learn new things. For example, I'm currently learning how to solder and repair sewing machines—skills I've never tackled before, but the experience has been fantastic and enriching.

I'd also like to mention Chris, one of the experienced volunteers here. He was among the founding members and has been a major source of inspiration and knowledge for me.
